Transport

Most of the following transport indicators have been developed specifically for the Local Plan, with use of some data sources aligned with other programmes for the purposes of efficiency, consistency and reliability. It is also intended that Local Plan monitoring reports will cross-reference other applicable local transport monitoring programmes, including programmes derived from the upcoming Local Transport Plan, LCWIP, Sustainable School Travel Strategy and Climate Change Action Plan. Medway Council are also aware of other useful data sources which will be referenced should they continue to be developed and supported long-term (for example, Transport for South East's Regional Travel Survey data, and Department for Transport's connectivity tool – currently in beta). Furthermore, Medway Council will seek to take advantage of any new sources of data which may arise (such as more detailed passenger rail data which may become available over time from Great British Railways). Where targets are indicated by direction only, these targets will be developed and refined over the course of the life of the Local Plan with the aim of continuous improvement.
